The Promises Of God: He Rescues His People

More than 3000 years ago there was a named Jacob. His grandfather Abraham was called the father of their faith. Jacob had twelve sons, the next to the youngest son was Joseph. He was sold into slavery in Egypt. This country was the center of the world. There was an army that had not been defeated. The ruler was called Pharoah. He was consider a god. The people worshipped other false gods for everything from the sun to fertility. Joseph, even as a slave, rose to the second most important position in Egypt after Pharoah. When Jacob and Joseph's brothers were threatened by a famine, they came to Egypt and were reunited with Joseph. They lived in the most lush part of Egypt and their families grew over many generations.

They were called Hebrews and they become more populus than the Egyptians. That was when a new Pharoah made the Hebrew people slaves. They were in Egypt for 400 years until the fear grew so great that another Pharoah ordered that all the male babies under two years old be killed. Now Pharoah had a daughter. While she was by the Nile River she spotted a basket which had a baby boy. She raised this baby boy and named him Moses. For forty years Moses lived as a prince of Egypt. He enjoyed all the pleasures of Egypt and it's power. Then one day he discovered an Egyptian abusing a Hebrew. He met a woman there, married her, had children, and became a shepherd.

He is the God who creates languages. He is the God who spoke the words so that birds appeared in the skies, animals appeared on land, creatures appeared in the seas. He is the God who made the land, the sky, the sea. He is the God who spoke light into existence. He is the God, Elohim, who formed a man out of the ground, breathed life into the man, took out a rib and created a woman to be a helpmate for the man. He is the God who entered a covenant with His creation.

He is the God who can turn the Nile to blood; bring locusts, frogs, boils as plagues; kill the cattle in the fields; and bring about the death of every first born male Egyptian. He is the God who can separate the sea, make dry land, and then close the sea and drown Pharoah's army. He is the God who can bring water out of a rock, cause manna to fall on the ground each morning, quail to appear each day, clothes to never wear out, and lead the people to the promised land.

The Lord God, Yahweh Elohim, is the only God, the living God, the creator God, the sustainer God, and the God who makes and keeps His promises, the God who rescues His people, and the God who is so completely different than anything on the earth or above that earth that He is holy.

He is the one who can see the past, the present, and future at the same time. He was before there was anything. He is here now. He will be forever. He is the first. He is the last. There is no one like Him. He reintroduces Himself in new ways with every appearance. He is making Himself own as He is. He exists, He is alive. He alone can hold these titles. This is the name by which He wants to be known. He is I AM.

We are our own worst enemy and we are always in need of rescue. Sometimes we need to be rescued from our circumstances. We've been there. We've found ourselves in financial trouble and need to be rescued. We've sat in the doctor's office or the Emergency Room needing to be rescued. We've been surround by noise, chaos, children and adults needing to be rescued. The car your driving is in a crash and you need to be rescued. The dog is chasing you down the street, you need to be rescued. The bully is taking your lunch and your money, you need to be rescued. The Mormons are at the door and you need to be rescued. You're on the top rung of the ladder, the wind is blowing, you need to be rescued.

But then there are the moments we need to be rescued from ourselves. This is when our bad thinking, our poor decision making has gotten us in trouble. You've lied to your parents. You've taken something from your brother. You've cheated on the test. Your brain has you chasing your tail. You need to be rescued.

You've slurped down so much coffee that you're anxious and irritable all the time. You've been angry for so long that you don't know how to be happy. You've told so many lies, so many stories that no one believes you. You've been so mad that when the car won't start you slam the door and break the window. You believe that bad things are going to happen and all you see is the bad stuff. Your heart is set on being liked so you've become a leaf in the breeze. You think your worth nothing as a result you do nothing. You believe your only value comes from proving everyone else is wrong. You need to be rescued.

The great I AM is the only God who can always rescue. Regardless of your circumstances or your thinking God can rescue you. You are not doomed. There is hope for you. But you are not your hope.

The God who calls Himself I AM is your hope. He will meet you in any situation. He will by His authority over all things and His power to do all things will bring about what is good. He will rescue you. His power will be released into your life. He will provide a way out and a way through. He will give you knowledge and wisdom. He will open your eyes to see. He will speak to your heart and give you peace. Nothing is impossible for Him. Through Him all things are possible. He is the I AM.

As I look back it's amazing how that simple choice delivered me, rescued me from myself and my situation. I was free to do God's will, carrying out His plans and purposes. Then there was hope. Then there was peace. That's when I was empowered. That was when I knew I was no longer a slave.

Being free to trust the God, who calls Himself I AM, empowers me to do His will. I don't have to be the one who brings about plagues. I don't have to open the sea and make dry ground. I don't have to give up my son. God does all that stuff.

I get to speak His truth. I get to point people toward His way. I get to talk about the life He offers. Can you see the difference? One way everything depends upon me. I'm inadequate, weak, a little dense, and even frail. The great I AM is adequate, strong, wise, and powerful.

All of this world, the things we see and the things we don't see, respond to His voice. All the things that happen are according to His plans and purposes. There is nothing that happens that He doesn't know about and permit. He is true to His word, He makes promises, and He keeps His promises. He gives me power. He gives me wisdom. He gives me peace. He gives me hope.

He is worthy of my trust. He is always ready when I call upon Him. He is the I AM.
