

The Pastor Said:

Thank you Jesus for your protection and wisdom during this most recent snow storm.

It was truly a lot of snow. I remember when we lived in western New York state and a foot of snow fell a couple of times a month. Lake effect snow is what they called it. When I woke up Sunday morning to let the dog out I had to push the snow out of the way with the door. The dog started into the snow, stopped and looked around before going any further. I felt the cold blast of air and decided at the moment that church was canceled.

When the snow finally stopped I got out the snowblower and cleared our shared driveway, sidewalks, the neighbors sidewalks, and the sidewalk for the entire 300 block of South Fourth Street. Don't you wish you were my neighbor. I didn't see a person until the end. I cleared her walkway to her porch, she got in her car and drove away. She was very grateful.

The crew repairing the plaster in the Sanctuary worked seven days, some days morning, afternoon, and evening to finish all the repairs. There are pictures on page 3. They spent at least 32 working hours cleaning up: vacuuming the carpet and the pews, washing the wainscoting, the pews and all the wood surfaces. Thank you to Christine, Donna, Jim, Rick, Randy, Diane and Lloyd for helping clean and return the hymnals & Bibles back into the pews, setting up the rest of the Sunday School room, and rehanging pictures; and to Norma, who vacuumed all 26 of our double pews. Thank you, Norma! We had the red curtains at the Bap-tistry dry cleaned and rehung.

There are two things that need follow up. A section of the wainscoting at the southeast entrance had rotted from previous water damage. I will be working to get that replaced. Also, I inadvertently broke the glass on the large Communion Table.

On to February. **Sunday, February 15** at 6 PM, the Coshocton Ministerial Association will be holding a time of prayer for the lost. The next few Sunday's there will be box at the front of the Sanctuary for you to put in the names of family, neighbors, and co-workers who need Jesus. These boxes, with all the names, will be prayed over at that service.

Our Sunday morning times of worship will be focused on *Sharing Your Faith*. I will be presenting four of eight ways we can talk with family, friends, and neighbors about Jesus. On Tuesday afternoons from 4-5 PM I will be sharing four different ways to let others know about Jesus. There are actually more than eight ways. Then on February 28, at our Saturday Breakfast and Bible Study, I will put these four ways of sharing Jesus into an hour presentation.

God is doing a great thing touching the lives of sinners. His Spirit is moving among believers to water, plant, and harvest the seeds of the Good News of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit is convicting people of their sin, calling them to salvation in Jesus Christ.

As Bible believing disciples of Jesus committed to making more disciples, we are a part of this movement. We can continue to pray for family, neighbors, and co-workers to see their sin and their need for salvation. We can pray for the seed to planted, watered and harvested. Our prayers can be for eyes, ears, minds, and spirits to see that God wants them saved and He loves each one. Let's continue to pray for those who are lost.


Dear First Baptist Church & Congregation:


